Waywayseecappo Adult Education Program

Waywayseecappo First Nation has provided learning for adults for several years in its local Adult Learning Centre. It is one of the approximately 50 such registered centres in 89 sites in Manitoba.

Adult learners from Waywayseecappo have participated in literacy and upgrading programs, earned high school credits, and graduated with Manitoba high school diplomas.

The adult program in Waywayseecappo offers the mature High School Diploma Program which requires eight credits to graduate, four at the Grade 12 level. Previous credit courses can be applied to the mature student high school diploma. Computer instruction is offered in keyboarding, word processing, and spreadsheets.

Adult learning centres are registered on an annual basis under the Adult Learning Centres Act to provide tuition free high school credit and upgrading courses using recognized principles of adult education. The Adult Learning Centres – General Regulation also came into force July 1, 2003 to provide educational programming to enable adult learners to obtain recognized educational credentials or other necessary prerequisites to pursue further education and employment opportunities.

A registered ALC is authorized by the Province of Manitoba to provide credits for high school courses and to issue high school diplomas. It follows Department of Education-developed and/or approved curricula, and its learners meet provincial high school graduation standards. A registered ALC has the same degree of authority, responsibility and credibility as a high school within the province.

Adult Learning is dedicated to improving the educational and employment prospects of our province's adults by working with Manitoba's adult learning centres.

Waywayseecappo / Park West Off-Campus Classroom

The Off-Campus Classroom is a recent initiative of the Waywayseecappo First Nation and Park West School Division. The classroom offers students who had challenges at school the opportunity to complete their education in a more flexible setting. The classroom is staffed by a 1.50 fte teachers and a teacher assistant.

The classroom is open to students aged 16 – 21 who are not attending high school at the present time. They may include:

- Students currently not registered in any high school
- Students registered in a high school, but not attending

The expectations for students and staff in the Off-Campus program are simple and straight-forward:

- Be respectful
- · Take responsibility for your own success

The Off-Campus teachers meet with students to set new goals. Ultimately students must meet their own goals in order to be successful and graduate from high school.

Course requirements here are the same as they are at other Manitoba High Schools. We offer a combination of teacher-led and self-directed courses. These include courses at the grade 9 to 12 levels.


Students can graduate in one of two different ways:

- A regular graduation (30 credits are required)
- Mature student graduation

Students may take a combination of teacher-led and self-directed courses, including:

In addition to the regular course work, we will organize small group sessions on a range of topics such as first aid, job search skills, family studies, drivers' education, and cultural awareness.

School Attendance Guidelines

School catchment areas in the Park West School Division are established to assist with planning and administration. Students are expected to attend in their catchment area or designated school (please see the maps on our website at www.pwsd.ca/catchment-maps). Parents wishing to enroll their children at a school other than their area or designated school must submit the prescribed Provincial School of Choice form to the principal of the receiving school by May 15th for September enrollment. Registrations will only be accepted after January 10th for students who are school eligible in September of that year. The form is available at all schools. Parents and students are further advised that although a request for school of choice is granted, existing bus routes will not be changed to accommodate such a request. Parents will be responsible to transport the student to the nearest existing pick up point.

Class Size Guidelines for School of Choice Applications

All School of Choice applications for Park West School Division schools are subject to the following class size guidelines.

K- Grade 3 Classes:

- 20 students
- Once these class size numbers have been reached at K-3, Principals shall declare the class as being full.

Caps are based on enrollment as of June 1st.

Grade 4 - Grade 8 Classes:

- 21 students
- Once these class size numbers have been reached at Grades 4 – 8, Principals shall declare the class as being full.

Caps are based on enrollment as of June 1st.

The school may also refuse School of Choice requests based on the following:

- Special equipment or facility needs.
- Program suitability and continuity with respect to age, ability, and student's aptitude.
- School safety and other risk factors.
- Timeline for proper notification.

The priority of the division for admission for School of Choice students are as follows:

- 1. Resident students from within the Park West School Division, in order of the date of initial receipt of the application at the school. Registrations will only be accepted after January 10th for students who are school eligible in September of that year.
- 2. Non-resident students, in order of the date of initial receipt of the application at the school.

Special Needs

There may be times when special arrangements will need to be made in order to accommodate special needs students. Such requests for special consideration will need to be identified in the student's IEP plan. Requests of this nature must come from the Student Services Coordinator.
