Topic: Executive Summary of the November 14 Regular Board Meeting

 The Board passed motions granting out-of-catchment school bus transportation to eight families. These individual motions temporarily reversed divisional procedure AP 115 School Attendance Guidelines. These motions were made on a without prejudice basis and procedure AP 115 continues to apply in all other cases.

- 2. Representatives from regional Lions Clubs presented on the topic of the Kidsight Program. Lions Foundation of Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario, in partnership with regional Lions Clubs, offer a quick, simple screening program for children. In a matter of minutes, a child's parent or caregiver can know if a follow up with an eye care professional is recommended.
- 3. The Secretary-Treasurer has been completing 2018-19 financial declarations, supporting the Park West Fibre Optics Co-op Board and preparing for the PWSD Foundation Annual General Meeting.
- 4. Several divisional schools did very well with Terry Fox fundraising this year. In the small school category, two divisional schools are noted in the top 5: Hamiota Elementary with \$3969 for 130 students at an average of \$30.00 per student and Inglis School with \$2812 for 50 students and a \$56.24 average.
- 5. The year-end supper and banquet for the Park West Outlaws is scheduled for Sunday, November 17.
- 6. The next biannual meeting for the Waywayseecappo / Park West partnership will be November 28.
- 7. The week of December 9-13, Edwin reps from Ontario will be in the division to present at the principal meeting, to visit classrooms, and to facilitate a PD session with Grade 7-8 teachers regarding our Chromebook technology pilot.
- 8. The Birtle and District foundation announced their RBC Future Launch Community Challenge grant recipients at an event on November 9. The Birtle Collegiate Peer Helpers BCI received \$15,000 for their project that addresses an urgent need they have identified in their community.
- 9. Trustee representatives updated the Board of the finance committee, the local voices, local choices group, and the ad hoc committee looking at the Trustee handbook.
