

The Board encourages students, teachers, and community members to submit applications based on the following criteria:

- I. Volunteer service to the community, such as volunteering with health care facilities, senior citizen groups, shelters, and daycare centers.
- 2. Involvement in citizenship or character building organizations.
- 3. Participation in student government programs or activities.
- 4. Leadership ability to motivate others to actions to benefit the community.

The Board was pleased to receive nine individual applications and seven group applications. Each nominee was presented with a certificate and a gift to recognize their commitment to citizenship.


